

## **Monday, January 18—Exodus 22-24**

This section details many of the social laws that were to govern the community of the people of Israel; notice how central and defining God is to the community life of the people; notice also the sovereign, providential activity of God in the life of the nation.

## **Tuesday, January 19—Exodus 25-27**

A detailed description of the Tabernacle and its furnishings; notice how God instructs Moses to take care that it be according to the pattern that he saw on the Mountain.

## **Wednesday, January 20—Exodus 28, 29**

The description of the priestly garments and the consecration of the priests; by these the priests were sanctified, set apart for the service of God in the Tabernacle; holy to the Lord.

## **Thursday, January 21—Exodus 30-32**

Further description of the furnishings of the Tabernacle; also the account of the golden calf. Take note of the requirements and solemn demands of the holiness of God. What does this suggest concerning the disposition that should characterize us as we think of, worship, and live before Him?

## **Friday, January 22—Exodus 33-35**

Moses meets with God and intercedes on behalf of the nation to deliver it from the judgement of God; God is merciful and forgives the people. But notice, again, the expressions of the solemn demands of the holiness of God; also expressions of the Sovereignty of God (Ex.33:19).

## **Saturday, January 23—Exodus 36-38**

The description of the construction of the Tabernacle and its furnishings; note the providence of God in granting to those who worked on the Tabernacle the knowledge and skills with which they worked.

## **Sunday, January 24—Exodus 39, 40**

The completion of the construction of the Tabernacle and its furnishings; the anointing of Aaron and his sons as priests; the erection Tabernacle; the glory of God descends upon the Tabernacle; note the repeated refrain, "As the Lord commanded Moses."
