

**Monday, February 8—Leviticus 19-21**

Further stipulations governing the life and activity of the people arising from the holiness of God; how does this section reinforce the reality that the holiness of God is absolutely definitive and determinative for the conduct God's people; does this hold for us today (see 1 Peter 1:13-16).

**Tuesday, February —Leviticus 22, 23**

Further instructions concerning the offerings and the celebration of feasts and holy days. What reality regulated the behavior of the people in all their participation in these elements of their religious life? In other words, what was the standard according to which they were to conduct themselves?

**Wednesday, February 10—Leviticus 24, 25**

More instructions concerning the Tabernacle, punishment for blasphemy, and the redemption of property. In chapter 25 what do we learn about the relationship between our treatment of another person and our attitude toward God (vv.36, 43)?

**Thursday, February 11—Leviticus 26, 27**

The promised blessings for obedience and curses for disobedience of the Law of God, and some final instructions regarding things devoted to God. According to chapter 26 what is the covenant upon which God's dealings with His people is founded (vv.44-45).

**Friday, February 12—Numbers 1, 2**

The original census of the people, those men of age to go to war and the description of the four main camps of the Israelites. What further description of the striking demands of God's holiness do we find in these chapters?

**Saturday, February 13—Numbers 3, 4**

The consecration of the Levites and the description of their duties in the Tabernacle. How is the striking and demanding holiness of God once again set before us in this passage?

**Sunday, February 14—Numbers 5, 6**

Further instructions about consecration; where are the demands of God's holiness evident in this section?
