

Monday, January 13—Genesis 36-38

How are God's kingdom purposes furthered in the events of this section, specifically in what occurs with Joseph in Genesis 37?

Tuesday, January 14—Genesis 39-41

What attribute or attitude towards God do we see demonstrated in the life of Joseph throughout these events? What reality about God lies behind this attitude?

Wednesday, January 15—Genesis 42-44

What is Joseph seeking to ascertain concerning his brothers through his treatment of them when they come to get grain in Egypt? What does Joseph's treatment of his brothers reveal about them? What issue does it bring to the surface?

Thursday, January 16—Genesis 45-47

What truth about God does Joseph's statement to his brothers in Gen.45:5-8 reveal? How did Joseph understand his having come to Egypt and what happened to him there?

Friday, January 17—Genesis 48-50

What does Joseph's statement in Genesis 50:24 indicate about his understanding of God's purposes and what He would do with His people? What was this understanding based upon (see. Gen.12:1-3)?

Saturday, January 18—Exodus 1-3

What does the statement concerning the people of Israel (the descendants of Jacob) in Exodus 1:7, specifically the statement that they *"multiplied and grew exceedingly strong so that the whole land was filled with them"*, indicate concerning their identity as a people and God's promised purposes for them (see Gen.1:28; 12:1-3)

Sunday, January 19—Exodus 4-6

What do we learn about God from the statements that he makes about himself and about what is his about to do throughout this section?
