

Monday, January 20—Exodus 7-9

How does God demonstrate that He is the King of the kingdom, the One who reigns over all, in this section—see specifically 7:3-7; 8:16-19; 9:12, 13-16?

Tuesday, January 21—Exodus 10-12

What was God seeking to show to the children of Israel by the wonders He was working in Egypt (10:1-2)?

Wednesday, January 22—13-15

What truth about God do the people confess in their song of praise after they are delivered through the Red Sea? In what ways is God declared to be the Sovereign One?

Thursday, January 23—Exodus 16-18

In what ways is the heart of the people revealed in the events recorded in this section? What does this indicate regarding their ability to live as God's people in God's place under God's rule?

Friday, January 24—Exodus 19-21

What does God require of the people if they are to be His people, dwelling in his place (Exodus 19:5)? What provision does He make for them to equipping them to do that?

Saturday, January 25—Exodus 22-24

What were the people to do if they were to arrive in the land that God had chosen (see 23:20-21)? What promise did God make to them to encourage them in this requirement (vs.22)? What does this reveal concerning the nature and character of God?

Sunday, January 26—Exodus 25-27

What was significant about the ark of the covenant, particularly with respect to God's covenant relationship with His people (see 25:22)? What does the fact that God would meet with His people at the mercy seat effectively make the ark of the covenant or, by extension, the Tabernacle (hint—it is one of the three elements of the Kingdom: God's people, God's place, God's rule)?
