Tuesday, March 24—Judges 11-13

What examples of God's providential activity do we see in these chapters? Again, what do these examples indicate about the world in which we live? How should they shape our thinking about the things that occur in the affairs of mankind?

Wednesday, March 25—Judges 14-16

How does Samson's tragic life reflect the life of the nation of Israel at this point in their history? What sin in Israel's life does Samson's obsession with foreign women reflect? What does Samson's tragic end indicate regarding where Israel's apostacy would lead?

Thursday, March 26—Judges 17-19

What was the underlying reason for Israel's complete disarray as a nation? What do the people of Israel need if they are to be rescue from their pathetic condition?

Friday, March 27—Judges 20-21

Thinking back to the book of Genesis, and in particular, to the account of Lot's rescue from Sodom, what does the account of the Levite and his concubine indicate that Israel has become?

Saturday, March 28—Ruth 1-4

What is pictured in the relationship between Ruth and Boaz? What does this account represent with respect to God's relationship to His people, Israel?

Sunday, March 29—1 Samuel 1-3

How is the steadfast love of God towards His people, Israel, demonstrated in the account of Hannah?
