

## ***Thru the Bible- May 4-10***

## **2 Kings 15- 1 Chronicles 6**

### **Monday, May 4- 2 Kings 15, 16**

Notice the hand of the Lord's discipline upon the nation of Israel (15:37); that the oppression that came by the Assyrians was according to the purposes of God;

### **Tuesday, May 5- 2 Kings 17, 18**

Why did the destruction of Samaria come upon them (2 Kings 17:7f; see also, Deut.28:15f)? What aspects of God's character are demonstrated in His sending prophets to warn Israel (17:13; Ex.34:6-7)?

### **Wednesday, May 6- 2 Kings 19-21**

Notice Hezekiah's prayer in 19:15-19: what is the ultimate aim of his prayer? What does he seek in the prayer that he prays? What does this teach us concerning the ultimate aim of prayer?

### **Thursday, May 7- 2 Kings 22-25**

How does the book of 2 Kings end (25:27-30)? What does this suggest concerning the future of the nation; of God's plans with respect to the nation? Does it indicate that God is done with the nation, or does it indicate that there is a future for them?

### **Friday, May 8- 1 Chronicles 1**

Notice the progression of the genealogy, from the lesser to the greater → 1:1 → 1:4, 5, 8, 17 → 1:28, 29, 32, 34a → 1:34b, 35, 38, 43;

### **Saturday, May 9- 1 Chronicles 2-4**

Notice the statement concerning Er the son of Judah (1 Chron.2:3; Gen.38:7). What does this indicate concerning the sovereignty of God over the works of His hands?

### **Sunday, May 10- 1 Chronicles 5, 6**

Note the men of Gad and their battle against the Hagrites (1 Chron.5:20)—what happened and why?
